INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

On 9 Aug 04, this investigation was initiated upon receipt of Memorandum of Transmittal
 (MOT) (0124-04-CID259-80294) from the 75th Military Police Detachment (CID), Baghdad
 Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq, wherein Mr [REDACTED] and Mr [REDACTED]
 reported they were assaulted prior to their detention at the BCCF. *b7c-4, b6-4*

Due to a totality of the circumstance, this investigation determined there was insufficient *b7c-4, b6-4*
 evidence to prove or disprove the allegations of abuse as alleged by Mr [REDACTED] and Mr [REDACTED].
 During the time of the alleged abuse, the victims were being transported in a convoy from Camp
 Cuervo, Baghdad, Iraq, to BCCF. While being transported, the convoy was attacked with a
 Vehicle Borne Improvised Explosive Device (VBIED). The blast from the VBIED attack

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caused the entire convoy to be disrupted and caused the soldiers to become totally disoriented. At the time of the attack, PFC [REDACTED] Headquarters Service Battery, 1st BN, 82nd Field Artillery, FOB Cuervo, APO AE 09373, was in the gunner's hatch. The blast, which disoriented him also, engulfed his face in flames, blew his Interceptor Vest open and shoulder guards off, and knocked him down into the vehicle. PFC [REDACTED] also had piece of metal protruding from his neck. At this point, while being disoriented, PFC [REDACTED] became angry and kicked at Mr. [REDACTED] but one of his fellow soldiers stopped him. PFC [REDACTED] was not sure if he may have kicked Mr. [REDACTED] moments earlier or not. Testimonial evidence did not develop any witnesses to corroborate Mr. [REDACTED] allegation. b7c-4

Additionally, Mr. [REDACTED], who was in the lead vehicle, alleged he was struck in the face and thigh. Testimonial evidence determined that PFC [REDACTED] was transferred to the lead vehicle after the attack but no one witnessed him committing any acts of abuse towards Mr. [REDACTED]. Further investigation did not diminish the interrogatory or credibility of Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] allegation. b7c-4

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Basis for Investigation: On 9 Aug 04, this office received a Memorandum of Transmittal (0076-04-CID789) from the 75th Military Police Detachment, Baghdad Central Correctional Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq, detailing that Mr. [redacted] Internment Serial Number (ISN) [redacted] and Mr. [redacted] ISN: [redacted], alleged they had been assaulted while being transported by U.S. Forces to the BCCF after a Vehicle Borne Improvised Explosive Device attack (VBIED). (See AIR of SA [redacted] for details)

About 1006, 17 Aug 04, SA [redacted] advised PFC [redacted] Headquarters Service Battery (HSB), 1st BN, 82nd Field Artillery (1/82 FA), FOB Cuervo, APO, AE 09373 (FCAA), of his legal rights which he waived and provided a sworn statement detailing the details of his convoy being hit by a VBIED on 29 Jul 04 while transporting detainees to Abu Ghraib. PFC [redacted] related after the explosion occurred he attempted to kick the detainee (Mr. [redacted] whom was the detainee in his vehicle being transported. PFC [redacted] stated he attempted to kick the detainee because he was very angry, and attempted to kick him and was not sure if he made contact as the other soldiers in his vehicle stopped him from assaulting the detainee. About 1150, 17 Aug 04, SA [redacted], this office, interviewed 2LT [redacted] Headquarters Service Battery (HSB), 1st BN, 82nd Field Artillery (1/82 FA), FOB Cuervo, APO, AE 09373 (FCAA), who provided a sworn statement, wherein he related he was in the vehicle when the improvised explosive device (IED) explosion knocked him unconscious. 2LT [redacted] stated he awoke and was dazed. 2LT [redacted] related that he concerned himself with gaining control of his soldiers and the situation, but at no time did he observe PFC [redacted] strike or kick the Iraqi Detainee. (See Sworn Statement for details)

[redacted] explained the Detainee was blindfolded. PFC [redacted] stated he was the turret gunner and was focused on the incidents around him. PFC [redacted] stated he briefly observed PFC [redacted] approach his vehicle, but did not know if he was carrying anything. PFC [redacted] related PFC [redacted] tugged on his DCU pants and he looked down to see PFC [redacted]. PFC [redacted] related he did not hear or observe any commotion in the vehicle when he was the turret gunner, but stated there was a lot of yelling after PFC [redacted] HMMWV was struck by the IED.

About 1711, 2 Sep 04. SA *b7c-1, b6-1* [redacted] interviewed SGT *b7c-4, b6-4* [redacted], HSB, 1-82 FA, 1 CAV DIV, Camp Cuervo, Baghdad, Iraq, who provided a sworn statement detailing he was the TC in the first vehicle (the vehicle Mr. [redacted] was in) transporting detainees to Abu Ghraib. SGT [redacted] stated he did not witness anyone hit or abuse the detainee that was being transported in his vehicle. (See Sworn Statement for details)

About 0945, 13 Sep 04, SA *b7c-1, b6-1* [redacted] briefed MAJ *b7c-3, b6-3* [redacted] Chief of Military Justice, Office of the Staff Judge Advocate, 1 CAV BDE, Camp Victory, Baghdad, Iraq, on all aspects of this investigation. MAJ [redacted] opined there was insufficient evidence to prove or disprove the allegations of abuse occurred as originally reported by Mr. [redacted] and Mr. [redacted] *b7c-4, b6-4*

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DETAILS

Basis of Investigation: On 29 Jul 04, this office was notified by the 391st Military Police (MP) Battalion (BN) Operations, Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (AGI), that Detainee [REDACTED], Internment Serial Number (ISN) # [REDACTED], alleged he was hit with rifle in the eye, while being transported to BCCF on 29 Jul 04. A subsequent interview of [REDACTED] revealed his nephew, Detainee [REDACTED] ISN # [REDACTED], also was hit in the eye with a rifle, while being transported to BCCF. b7c-4

About 2210, 29 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1, with the assistance of Linguist [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3, arrived at the Detainee Inprocessing and Holding Area (IHA), and observed [REDACTED] being treated by SSG [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3, 391st MP BN, Detainee Aid Station (DAS), BCCF, AGI. [REDACTED] stated he was being transported to BCCF from his previous detention facility, when an explosion occurred. He said a few minutes later a soldier hit him in the face with a rifle stock. He stated he was blindfolded the entire time. [REDACTED] appeared to have a swollen right eye with no bruising. There was yellow matter in his eye. SSG [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] possibly had an eye infection commonly called "pink eye". She noted there was no bruising or cuts around the eye consistent with being "butt stroked" with a rifle a few hours before. b7c-4, b6-4

AGENT'S COMMENT: SSG [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3, advised to return the following morning when the doctor was available.

About 0930, 29 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1, with the assistance of Linguist [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3, meet with [REDACTED] and observed newly formed bruising under his right eye. [REDACTED] was examined by 1LT (DR) [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3, 391st MP BN, Detainee Aid Station (DAS), BCCF, AGI, who stated bruising was now present under [REDACTED] right which would be consistent with a blow to the eye a day prior. He stated the appearance of an infection could have been caused if the stock of the rifle was dirty or if the detainee had a dirty cloth around his eyes. He stated it could have also been cause by irritation from the detainee after the incident. DR. [REDACTED] stated the bruising appeared to be about one day old. b7c-4, b6-4

About 1000, 29 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1, with the assistance of Linguist [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3, interviewed [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4, who stated he was captured on 17 Jul 04 in Baghdad, Iraq. He was detained at a US controlled facility he called Rostemia, near a Military College. He left enroute to BCCF sometime after lunch. He was riding in rear driver's side seat of what he thought was a four seat HMMWV. His hands were tied in the front and his eyes blind folded with a cloth tied around his head. He was unaware of which vehicle he was riding in. He could not describe the personnel who were transporting him, other than they were speaking English. He stated that while riding he heard a large explosion and then the vehicle stopped. He said about four minutes later someone opened the right rear door of the vehicle and hit him in the right eye with a hard object, he thought to be a "rifle butt". He said he was then hit in the right thigh twice with the same object. He said about 15 minutes later the vehicle began to move and he soon arrived at BCCF. He said he reported it to the soldier at the front.

About 1040, 30 Jul 04, SA [redacted] ^{b7c-1,166-1} with the assistance of Linguist [redacted] ^{b7c-3,66-3} interviewed [redacted] ^{b7c-4,166-4} who stated he was captured on 17 Jul 04 in Baghdad, Iraq. He was detained at a US controlled facility he called Rostemia, near a Military College. He left enroute to BCCF sometime after lunch. He was riding in rear driver's side seat of what he thought was a four seat HMMWV. His hands were tied in the front and his eyes blind folded with a cloth tied around his head. He stated he could partially see from under his blindfold. He stated he was riding in the middle vehicle, which was damaged by the explosion. He stated he could see the uniforms, which were the camouflage of the US Army. He said as they were traveling, the vehicle stopped. He heard what appeared to be a warning about a vehicle on the roadway. He said the vehicle started again and then he heard and felt a large explosion. He said the he heard someone say, "Go! Go! Go!" and then he saw and felt the soldier in the turret fall on him. The vehicle then stopped. He said he asked the soldier on top of him, "Mister, are you OK?" The soldier then said, "It's all because of you mother fuckers!" and began to punch him in the head. He said the soldier the got up and began to exit the turret, while kicking him in the head. He said what he believed was the same soldier open his door and "butt stroked" him in the left eye. He said his blindfold was still on but he could see the soldier's legs and the soldier holding a rifle. He said after the soldier hit him, he saw the soldier charge the rifle bolt. [redacted] ^{b7c-4,166-4} said some other soldiers then held the one soldier back. After a few minutes one soldier asked [redacted] if he was ok and then the vehicle began to move. He said they then arrived at BCCF.

AGENT'S COMMENT: This AIR entry was written in lieu of a written sworn statement, in order to provide better clarity of facts and detail related by the detainee.

About 1105, 30 Jul 04, SA [redacted] ^{b7c-1,166-1} exposed photographs of [redacted] ^{b7c-4,166-4} injury using a Nikon Cool Pix Digital Camera. (See Photographs)

About 1115, 29 Jul 04, SA [redacted] ^{b7c-1,166-1} requested [redacted] ^{b7c-4,166-4} be examined by DR. [redacted] ^{b7c-3,66-3} who stated the bruising over [redacted] left eye would be consistent with a blow to the eye a day prior.

About 1120, 30 Jul 04, SA [redacted] ^{b7c-1,166-1} inquired at the front desk area of the IHA if a unit had become victim of an IED attack on 29 Jul 04, while transporting detainees to this facility. The NCOIC, SGT [redacted] ^{b7c-3,66-3} 428th MP Company, BCCF, AGI, stated he recalled a [redacted] Cavalry unit, that transported [redacted] ^{b7c-4,166-4} and [redacted] to BCCF about mid afternoon, was hit with a

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DETAILS

Vehicle Born Improvised Explosive Device (VBIED). He stated the unit delivered three detainees, of which none made complaints to him about being hit. He further advised that it is procedure to examine each detainee for bruising or scars. While examining [REDACTED] he observed [REDACTED] right eye appeared to be irritated and he asked if his eye had any pain. [REDACTED] responded that it did not hurt. He further related no soldier from the escort team mentioned any incident involving the detainees. He stated that he took pictures of the vehicle and would provide them to this office. He also gave the name of the lieutenant in charge of the 1st Cavalry convoy that transported the detainee. He stated he believed it was black male named "1LT [REDACTED] (NFI). (See Photographs)

AGENT'S COMMENT: A review of the photographs revealed the bumper number "HSB 107".

About 1330, 29 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] queried the Biometrics Automated Toolset (BATS) and obtained the Personal Data Report (PDR) and a color photograph of both detainees taken on the morning of 30 Jul 04. (See PDRs)

AGENT'S COMMENT: All photographs taken by the Detainee In-processing Section were taken the morning of 30 Jul 04, due to the late arrival of the detainees.

AGENT'S COMMENT: The abuse allegation was made upon the detainee's arrival at BCCF, therefore no interrogation records exist nor was any canvass interviews conducted.

About 1600, 30 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with SFC [REDACTED] 391st MP BN, Detainee In-Processing Section, BCCF, AGI, and obtained copies of the detainee files for both detainees. (See Detainee Files)

About 1700, 30 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with 1LT (DR) [REDACTED] 391st MP BN, Detainee Aid Station (DAS), BCCF, AGI, who provided the Medical Screening Report for both detainees confirming his previous statements pertaining to there abuse allegations. He further stated that he did not see any bruising or injury to [REDACTED] right thigh, therefore he did not make note of it. (See Medical Screening Records)

About 1300, 31 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with SPC [REDACTED] Administration Clerk, Combat Support Hospital (CSH), BCCF, AGI, whop stated that PFC [REDACTED] Headquarters Support Battery (HSB) 182 (NFI), was treated for shrapnel wounds as a result of a VBIED incident on 29 Jul 04. She related all medical records were retained by the soldier upon his release on 30 Jul 04.

About 1315, 31 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] conducted canvass interviews of attending medical personnel for PFC [REDACTED]

CPT [redacted] b7c-3, b6-3, CSH, BCCF, AGI, stated that he asked PFC [redacted] b7c-4, b6-4 if anyone else was in the vehicle with him during the incident. PFC [redacted] replied that a detainee was in his vehicle when the incident occurred. CPT [redacted] stated that he had a conversation with "2LT [redacted] (NFI), PFC [redacted] supervisor, who stated that PFC [redacted] was in the turret when the explosion occurred. CPT [redacted] stated that PFC [redacted] walked into the CSH without any assistance and did not complain of any loss of consciousness. CPT [redacted] stated he did not know of any incident with a detainee nor did he know which vehicle PFC [redacted] was in. b7c-4, b6-4

SGT [redacted] b7c-3, b6-3, CSH, BCCF, AGI, stated that she had a conversation with PFC [redacted] in which he told her he was in the turret of the second vehicle when the explosion occurred. She further stated that PFC [redacted] was extremely shaken and crying, to the point that the Combat Stress Doctor visited him. She stated that he never mentioned anything about detainees. She recalled that MSG [redacted] from the 428th MP Company was also injured from the explosion and had a heated conversation with a Lieutenant from PFC [redacted] unit. She also stated that someone from the hospital was in a convoy, which drove up after the explosion, and had taken pictures. She does not know who took the pictures but she could provide our office with copies of the pictures after work.

SPC [redacted] b7c-3, b6-3, CSH, BCCF, AGI, stated that she had a conversation with PFC [redacted] in which he told her he was in the turret of the second vehicle when the explosion occurred. She further stated that PFC [redacted] was extremely shaken. She stated he never mentioned anything about detainees. SPC [redacted] stated that PFC [redacted] walked into the CSH without any assistance and did not complain of any loss of consciousness.

About 1400, 31 Jul 04, SA [redacted] b7c-4, b6-1 interviewed MSG [redacted] b7c-3, b6-3 428th MP Company, BCCF, AGI, who stated he was in the convoy which had stopped prior to the vehicle and had sat up a protective perimeter. He was in the turret of the third vehicle, when he saw a convoy stop at the lead vehicle and then begin to drive towards the suspect vehicle. He said he saw the explosion but did not see any activity of the other convoy after the explosion, due to checking soldiers in his convoy. He stated that no one from his convoy went to the location of the other convoy and it's location was about 200 meters away. He stated that even if he was looking, he could not have seen any activity in the other convoy.

About 1530, 31 Jul 04, SA [redacted] b7c-4, b6-1 interviewed CPT (DR) [redacted] b7c-3, b6-3 785th Combat Stress Company, BCCF, AGI, who stated that during his conversation with PFC [redacted] he never mentioned anything about detainees, but did state that he was in the turret of the second vehicle in the convoy. I could feel the heat from the explosion engulf my face and body. The next thing I remember was falling into the truck. My flack vest was blown open, my shoulder guard was also blown off. My kevlar had a gash on the forehead side. There was debris in the vehicle and a high pitched ringing in my ears. Everything was moving in slow motion. I remember looking at my arms and legs and looking for blood. I asked SPC [REDACTED] if my face was ok and he said I was bleeding from my nose. I looked up and saw my shield in pieces and that's when SPC [REDACTED] noticed the shrapnel wound in my neck. At that point I got anxious and stood up in the turret. This is the first time I remember [REDACTED] (He was standing outside the vehicle) I said "If motherfuckers that did this are still out there!" Then I said "It's mother

Fuckers... like these guys trying to kill us," referring to the detainees. Namely the one in our vehicle. Then I turned to kick the detainee but LT [REDACTED] would not allow it. He called out to me and SPC [REDACTED] grabbed my legs. I might have kicked the detainee once before Lt. [REDACTED] grabbed me. Lt. [REDACTED] ordered me down from the gunners hatch. I was dazed and bleeding and he escorted me to the lead vehicle. Our vehicle had been damaged so bad that it had to be towed. When we arrived at Abu Ghraib Lt. 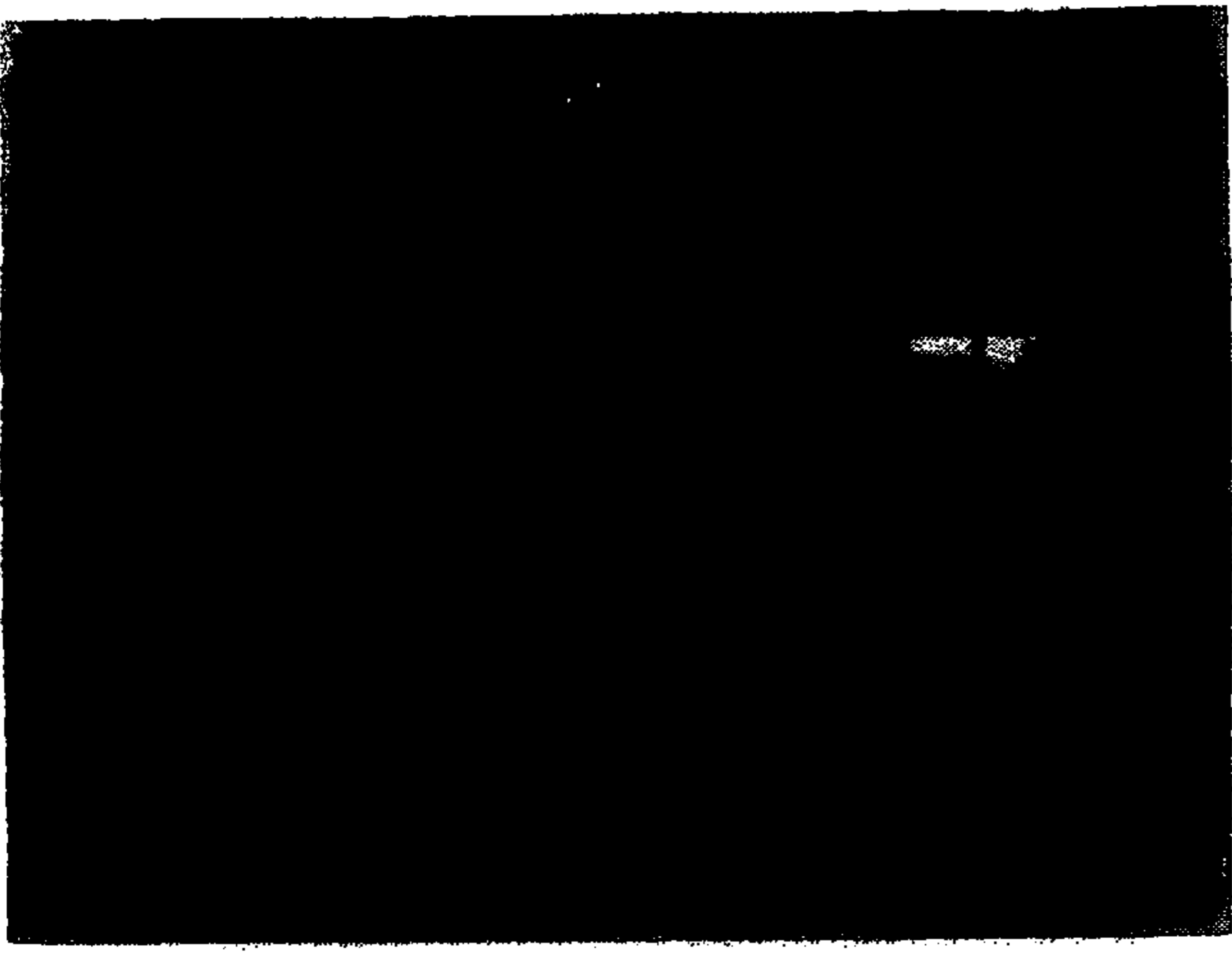

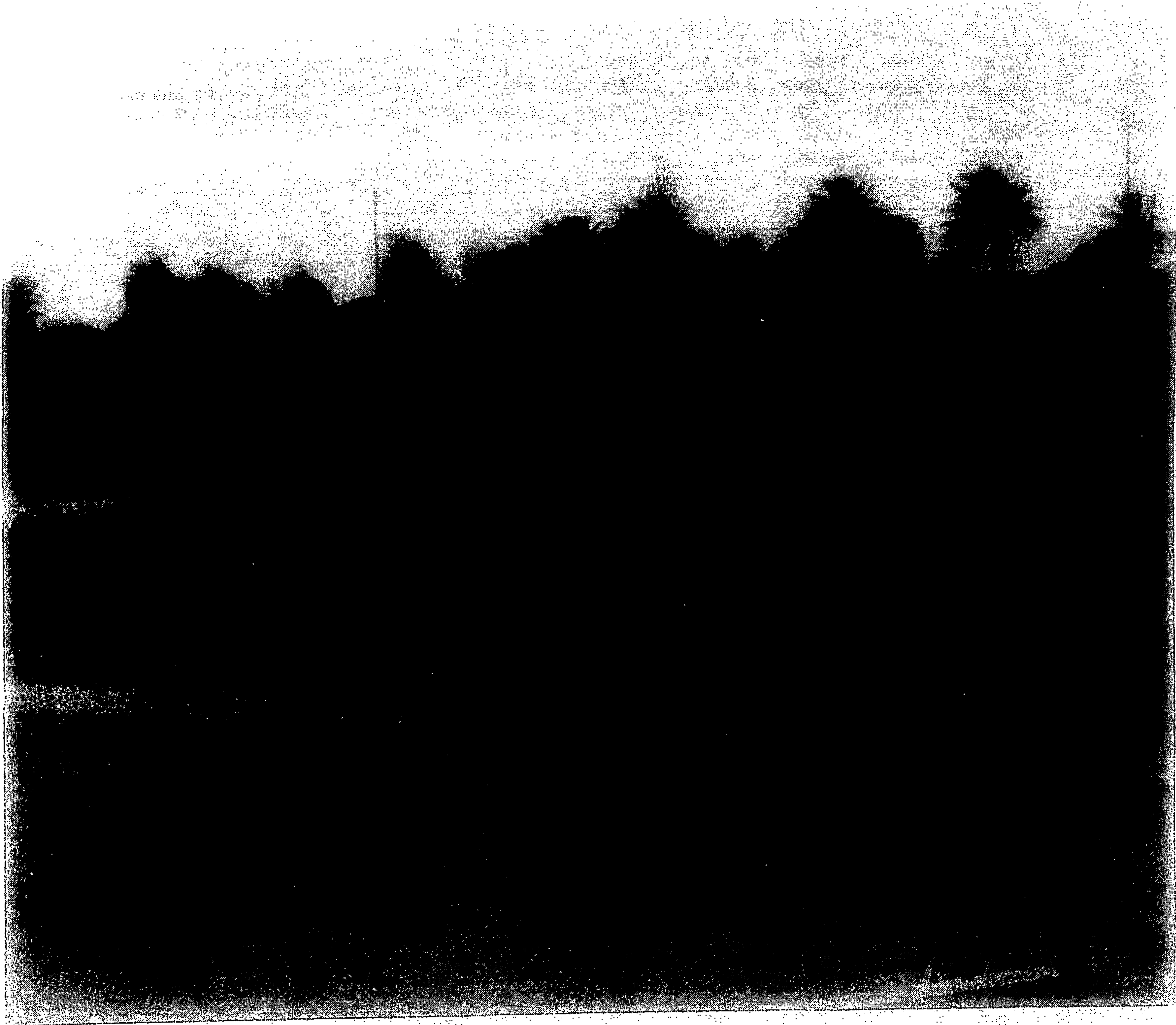
