After being asked to clarify exactly what had happened, [redacted] stated that the normal procedure to leave his cell to be interviewed was to lay on the floor face down and be handcuffed behind the back. On certain occasions the guards would place one of their boots on [redacted]'s back while handcuffing him. While this was happening another guard would hold down his feet. The floor was dirt and the rocks would cause him discomfort. [redacted] never suffered any broken bones, bleeding, or bruising. He felt it was unnecessary due to the fact that some guards handcuffed him without placing their boot on his back. [redacted] also remembers having his feet kicked as he walked to keep him moving.

After being advised of the identity of the interviewing agents and the purpose of the interview, [redacted] provided the following information:	
[redacted] requested that the above captioned interviewers re-interview him on this occasion. [redacted] was extremely cooperative during this interview and continually stated his goal was to cooperate and be truthful so that he may return home someday to his family.	
[redacted] advised he had been truthful and forthcoming when he had been interviewed on previous occasions. [redacted] inquired if the interviewers had any knowledge as to if he would soon be released from Camp Delta and be able to return to his homeland [redacted]	
[redacted] stated that one of the guards at Camp Delta recently removed his prayer cap from his head and threw it in the trash for no apparent reason. [redacted] now does not think it to be religiously proper to use this cap again.

[redacted] states he really did not know that much about [redacted]	
[redacted] then requested to be seen by a Dentist as soon as possible. [redacted] stated he needed to have a filling replaced. According to [redacted] he lost a filling from the right side of his mouth after he was kicked in the mouth by an American soldier in Afghanistan. [redacted] states that after he had been captured by the Northern Alliance and turned over to American soldiers, he was then interviewed on several occasions by the United States (US) military. According to [redacted] immediately after his final interview he was being taken back to the holding facility when he tripped and fell to the ground. [redacted] hands were handcuffed behind him at the time. Before [redacted] had an opportunity to stand up, [redacted] states a US soldier kicked him violently in his jaw. [redacted] states he did nothing to provoke this assault. Immediately after he was kicked [redacted] felt a piece of metal in his mouth. [redacted] thinks the piece of metal was a filling from one of his teeth. [redacted] was advised the interviewing agents would notify the Dentist assigned to Camp Delta of [redacted] medical condition.

[redacted] a surrender was negotiated [redacted] The conditions of the surrender were that the Taliban fighters would turn themselves over to the NA and would be transported, unhurt and without restraints, via trucks to Kandahar.

The trucks departed [redacted] at approximately 9:00 p.m. and traveled throughout the night. The convoy arrived in Mazer e' Sharif at approximately 6:00 a.m. the following morning. Negotiations between [redacted] and the NA continued until approximately 1:00 p.m. at which time [redacted] directed the fighters to surrender their weapons and reenter the vehicles.

Approximately four to five hundred fighters were transported to Al-Janki (the fortress) and escorted inside. No one was searched prior to them being escorted into the fortress and directed to sit down in a field. The fighters were allowed to pray and then were transferred to rooms located underneath the fortress. The rooms were dark and filled past capacity. The fighters slept that night.

The following morning, the NA began escorting the fighters one by one to the field. [redacted] was stripped of his outerwear and watch and approximately 10,000 Riyals. His arms were tied behind his back at his elbows and he was beaten. [redacted] recalled seeing western media and further recalled hearing two (2) Americans walking through the crowd. He was unable to describe the Americans because he was directed to keep his head down.

[redacted] During the detainment period, [redacted] advised that they were treated harshly. Periodically the prisoners would be brought out to be beaten and often they were not fed.

[redacted] stated that when they were placed into the makeshift prison in Bamyan, the prisoners were under the overall control of [redacted] a senior official with the Northern Alliance. [redacted] advised that while incarcerated, he and the other prisoners went through simple interrogations before being turned over to the immediate custody of [redacted] their jailor inside the prison. During this period, the prisoners were beaten with the butts of rifles and endured several more interrogations. After [redacted] finished with them, [redacted] and his fellow prisoners were turned over to [redacted] another Northern Alliance commander. During the transfer process from [redacted] to [redacted] and his fellow prisoners stayed inside the same prison and simply switched rooms or buildings.

While under the custody of [redacted] said his hands and feet were tied and he was placed in a large room with other people. The total number of people in the room was fourteen. Approximately two days after being held by [redacted] other prisoners were placed in the room with him bringing the total to 27 men held. [redacted] said that [redacted] would periodically bring money, food, and toiletries to the prisoners.

While being held prisoner at Bamyan, [redacted] saw Americans a few times. On one occasion he noticed American people taking pictures and others who appeared to be journalists taking pictures. The last time the Americans came to the prison, [redacted] stated they took hair samples, saliva samples, and interviewed/interrogated the prisoners. During this visit, one of the interpreters started talking to [redacted] and before he could finish telling how he had been conscripted into Taliban service, he was told to be quiet and to go sit in a corner. [redacted] opined that the interpreter, who spoke [redacted] did not fully understand what [redacted] who speaks [redacted] was trying to tell him. [redacted] stated that some of his fellow prisoners were let go, but he was sent from Bamyan to Baghram, where he was put into American custody.

[redacted] said that after being held for a time at Baghram, he went to Kandahar where he was placed on an airplane and brought to Cuba. [redacted] stated that he has never been severely mistreated while in American custody, however, in Baghram the handcuffs were placed on his hands too tightly. In Kandahar, [redacted] stated that he felt as

The mental condition of the detainees is to the point where the detainees are all participating in a hunger strike. The detainees are upset with the way they are treated by the guards. They are upset because they are being held as prisoners without being charged with a crime or released. The detainees think America is intentionally keeping people in custody for no reason other than an attack on Muslims. The detainees are going to strike by not changing their clothes, not eating food and not drinking water more than absolutely necessary. If one person starts a strike then all of the men will follow.

In the last six days, [redacted] has not taken more than three ounces of water per day. He has not eaten in six days. He has not changed his clothes in a week. He wanted to be charged with a crime or released. In [redacted] it would not take this long to investigate the innocent people.

According to the detainees, some of the guards are telling the detainees that while they are sitting in a cell in Cuba, American Soldiers are having sex with the detainee's mothers. According to the detainees, some of the guards are physically cruel to the detainees. [redacted] has not personally heard these comments from the guards. He has not seen any cruelty by the guards. However, sometimes the guards are a little rough with him even though he is cooperative.

These suicides will cause the people in the Middle East to solidify their anger against America. He does not know who is in charge of this event, when it is to occur or the people who might take their own lives

[redacted] was resting on his bed one day when a [redacted] contract worker began asking him questions [redacted]. The man asked him his name, [redacted] and other personal information. [redacted] provided [redacted] with the answers to his questions. [redacted] man said this information is valuable. [redacted] told the [redacted] about the two United States Marines recently killed in Kuwait by a man whose brother was in prison here at Camp Delta. They also told the detainees that the United States is gathering troops and its allies for an attack on Iraq. [redacted] claimed President Bush told CNN News that all Saudi Arabians were terrorists. [redacted] does not want this flow and exchange of information to stop. The exchange of information will make more people throughout the world aware of the conditions at Camp Delta and that America is detaining innocent people.

[redacted] detainees see the guards as babies, especially the "big American guards that fill the doorway." This is because the guards are supposed to be strong, yet they walk around with a "camel" (a backpack water storage device with a drinking tube attached) on their back sucking on the tube of water all of the time. A strong man is able to go without water for long periods of time. [redacted] suggested that the water be kept out of sight of the prisoners and have the guards walk to where the water is kept. The detainees look with disfavor and lose respect for women guards who are wearing or putting on lipstick in front of them.

[redacted] realizes that detainees do bad things to the guards that cause the guards to get mad. According to the detainees, if the guards want to be thought of as strong, they should not get angry and take their anger out on the detainees, even if the detainees give them cause to be angry. A strong man does not need to show meanness to a weak man. The detainees are wearing handcuffs and chains and the guards and interrogators are not. But all men are human and should be treated with respect. "To be a human means respect."

The water issue would not apply to the interrogators if they and the detainee are sharing water or tea out of respect for each other.

If the interviewers use force or coercion against [redacted] it will not work, they will just get stronger. "If you cut off their fingers, they get stronger." "If you cut off their forearm, they get stronger." "If you cut of their arm, they get stronger." While [redacted] was making those three statements, he was making three chopping motions with his left hand on top of his right hand, right forearm and right arm.

Numerous times during the interview, when asked a question by the male interviewer, [redacted] would look directly at the male interviewer, answer the question and with the palm of his right hand and touch his chest near his heart. This behavior was also demonstrated several times during the previous two interviews. He claimed the hand gesture to his heart was the highest form of respect he can show the interviewer. He claimed he was going to "write" the male interviewer's name on his heart and the female interviewer's name on his right upper arm. He claimed he respected the interviewers.

The mental condition of the detainees is to the point where the detainees are all participating in a hunger strike. The detainees are upset with the way they are treated by the guards. They are upset because they are being held as prisoners without being charged with a crime or released. The detainees think America is intentionally keeping people in custody for no reason other than an attack on Muslims. The detainees are going to strike by not changing their clothes, not eating food and not drinking water more than absolutely necessary. If one person starts a strike then all of the men will follow.

In the last six days, [redacted] has not taken more than three ounces of water per day. He has not eaten in six days. He has not changed his clothes in a week. He wanted to be charged with a crime or released. In [redacted] it would not take this long to investigate the innocent people.

[redacted] informed that prior to the [redacted] visit, the U.S. interrogators told him the information he provided would not be provided to [redacted] government, his picture would not be provided and no information about him or his family would be provided to the government [redacted]. Additionally (prior to the visit by [redacted] government), [redacted] advised that he was never mistreated and as far as he knows, none of the other [redacted] at Camp Delta, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, were mistreated. During the delegation visit, [redacted] stated that he met with [redacted] officials and they knew all of his personal information (i.e. name, birthplace, address, etc.) and he was unwillingly photographed by [redacted] officials. [redacted] indicated that he felt betrayed by the U.S. government and he does not believe anything that U.S. interrogators tell him. [redacted] explained that since the delegation visit, some of the [redacted] have been mistreated by the guards at the detention facility. [redacted] stated, "it's unbelievable, this is a U.S. prison, in the U.S., and [redacted] government is able to come here and do anything they want. It makes me wonder who's running this prison."
